DESCRIPTION

Projet Point Final proposes an educational program for people found guilty of driving, or having had the care or control of a vehicle when they were under the influence of alcohol or drugs (and/or with a level greater than the legal limit).

Participating in the program of *Projet Point Final* Project is an alternative to incarceration.

Projet Point Final is a non-profit organization that provides a free and confidential service.

OBJECTIVE

The project's main objective is to reduce the risk of repeat offences by informing and educating participants as to the consequences of driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

CONDITIONS

Eligibility for the program and its duration are determined by the Ville de Montréal Municipal Court's attorneys. A report on the participant's attendance will be presented to the attorneys prior to each appearance in court.

In the case of a first offence, the participant must:

- attend one *Projet Point Final* meeting each week during three months;
- attend one Alcoholics Anonymous meeting each week during three months;
- accept and respect the conditions imposed by the court.

If the participant is a repeat offender, he must:

- attend one *Projet Point Final* meeting each week during six to twelve months;
- attend two Alcoholics Anonymous meetings each week during six to twelve months;
- accept and respect the conditions imposed by the court.
